## A Word on Tithing

A “tithe” is an offering rendered as a sacrifice to God; the word *sacrifice* comes from the Latin words meaning “to make holy” by dedicating some good or setting it apart for God’s service. The word tithe in the Bible originally signified ten percent (10%). The tithe, however, is only a barometer or guideline to help determine one’s sacrificial giving. Some who earn far more than they need can and should offer more than a 10% tithe; others may have circumstances that warrant them paying less than a 10% tithe. If a tithe (10%) is honestly too much for one’s current budget, a member may begin with a lower percentage which will be both sacrificial and yet possible. Then the member may gradually raise the level of giving until the full tithe is reached.

Catholics’ obligation to support their parish is expressed in the 5<sup>th</sup> Precept of the Church. Families should involve their children in tithing by teaching them through word and by example the priority of returning to God a portion of the blessing He has given us. Children may do this through tithing their allowances or income from part-time jobs.

Those faithful Christians who do tithe (give sacrificially) report how remarkably their material needs have been met. Moreover, they will cite these blessings as even greater, spiritual rewards:

- reparation for past sins, especially selfishness and pride and scandal
- sense of serenity and satisfaction that comes from a spirit of generosity
- awareness that God’s service comes first, also in decisions about money
- a conscious decision to overcome the practice of making contributions that are mere “leftovers” or contributions given routinely out of mere habit
- a deep sense of satisfaction in the progress made by the Church due to giving by its members
- an ability to distinguish between mere empty or selfish desires and genuine needs
- a cautious awareness of the world’s and in particular, our society’s materialism
- a keener appreciation for the blessings we have received;
- an acknowledgment of the pain of poverty for many people in the world
- the gain for ourselves of a serene confidence in Our Lord’s protective care and Providence

As we begin the Lenten season, I ask you to reflect upon tithing and the spiritual opportunities it provides.

### A Word of Introduction

The Catholic Church has always had serious requirements for the reception of Holy Communion. Thus, all those who wish to receive Holy Communion at Immaculate Conception Church must:

-Be validly baptized in the Roman Catholic Church. Due to irregularities sometimes found in baptisms since the imposition of the “New Order,” those baptized after 1970 must speak with one of the priests before receiving Holy Communion.

-Have sufficient knowledge of the traditional Catholic catechism – such as the traditional Baltimore Catechism.

-Firmly believe and profess all doctrines of the Catholic Church. One must believe and abide by traditional Catholic moral teaching, especially regarding purity and marriage. Anyone who has received a marriage annulment since 1968 must talk to the priest before receiving Holy Communion.

-Be in the state of sanctifying grace, having made a good confession to a traditional Roman Catholic priest and received absolution.

-Be fasting from solid foods and alcoholic beverages for three hours and all other liquids for one hour. (Water does not break the fast and may be taken at any time.)

-Attend only the traditional Latin Mass offered by a true traditional Catholic priest.

-Be dressed suitably, i.e. respectfully and modestly (ask an usher for the flyer Standards for Dress). Catholics believe that the church is the House of God and that the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, His body and blood, soul and divinity. Therefore, we expect all who enter this church to show great respect by the way they behave and the way they dress.

Traditional standards require that ladies wear dresses, or full skirts and blouses. Hemlines must be long enough to cover the knees when one is seated. Necklines must be no more than two finger-widths below the collarbone. Slit skirts are not acceptable (a skirt is too tight if it needs to be slit to allow walking). Ladies are also required to wear a suitable head-covering while in church. Women wearing slacks, sleeveless dresses (including “capped” sleeves, which are not sleeves at all) or low necklines are not suitably dressed to receive Holy Communion. They should not even enter the church if their dress is immodest.

Gentlemen also must wear modest and decent clothing in church. Men must wear dress slacks and dress shirt, preferably with suit coat and tie. If their attire is immodest or indecent, they should not enter the church.

**Flip-flops, shorts, sweats, and T-shirts are not acceptable attire in the church. The wearing of revealing, tight-fitting and transparent garments of sheer material is forbidden.**

*Please do not come to receive Holy Communion at this church today if you do not meet these standards of suitable dress. Rather, please return when you are more appropriately attired. Furthermore: Anyone who adheres to the erroneous teachings of Father Leonard Feeney and Saint Benedict Center (denying the Church’s teaching concerning “baptism of desire” and “baptism of blood”), or who worships at religious services conducted by any of the Thuc bishops and their clergy, must not receive Holy Communion at Immaculate Conception Church. Please discuss this with our priests.*
